

A Zmanim Display for Our Shul

The proposal in one sentence: replace the printed zmanim sheet with a screen that updates itself — at no monthly cost to the shul.

Zmanim shift every week. A printed sheet is out of date within days, someone has to reprint and re-tape it, and the people who most need it — visitors and guests — are the ones reading the wrong time. DigitalShul turns a standard TV into a display showing exact halachic times, the Hebrew date, the parsha and our own announcements, calculated automatically from our shul's coordinates and time zone, refreshed every second.

One payment of \$250 covers the equipment and installation.
No monthly fees, no subscription, **no minimum term**.

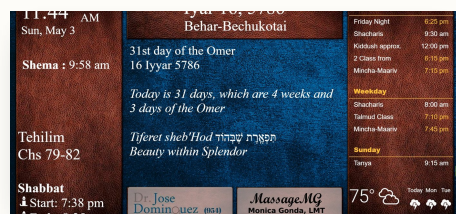
What makes it free: the screen carries advertising from Jewish businesses only — kosher caterers, community professionals and organizations relevant to our area.

WHAT THE SHUL RECEIVES

- ✓ Exact zmanim for our coordinates and time zone — and we choose which times are shown
- ✓ Hebrew calendar, parsha, Shabbat start and end times
- ✓ Our own announcements, managed by us through a web Dashboard (mobile app in development)
- ✓ Atomic clock synchronized to the second
- ✓ Rotating Torah inspiration and local weather
- ✓ Hardware, setup and activation included
- ✓ 24/6 human support — closed Saturdays for Shabbat

No commitment

No minimum term. We can stop at any time; we would simply return the equipment so it can be assigned to another synagogue.

WHAT THE SHUL PROVIDES

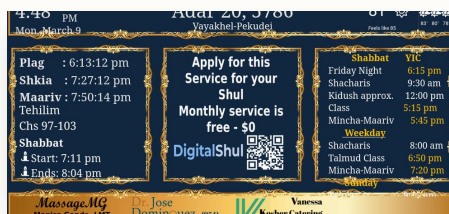
- A TV, 55"–70" recommended, in a high-traffic area
- Any existing internet connection — requirements are minimal
- A standard electrical outlet at the mounting location

INSTALLATION

- Two cables: HDMI to the TV, power to the wall
- Wi-Fi is configured from any phone in a few minutes, with their step-by-step guide and their team on the line
- No technician and no changes to our network

Equipment warranty

If the equipment fails, they replace it. The only charge is shipping — sending the faulty unit back and the new one out.
